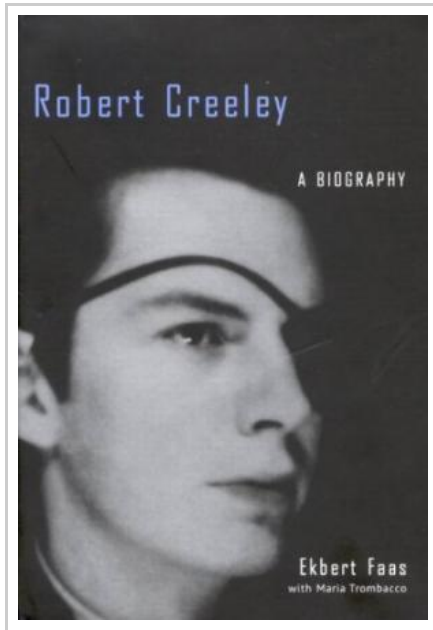




Robert Creeley - A Biography

This book is a biography which focuses on the first 40 years of Creeley's life - years of rebellion, restless travel, tumultuous liasons, and anger and violence that gave his writing an idiosyncratic new voice of razor-sharp precision and vehemence. As a small press publisher and editor, Creeley possessed an unflinching flair for recognizing talent, and promoted the likes of Layton, Ginsberg, Kerouac, Olson, and Burroughs . Their stars rose while he scraped by, until his poetry collection For Love and a novel, The Island, earned him fame and a critical acclaim largely denied the Beat writers.
