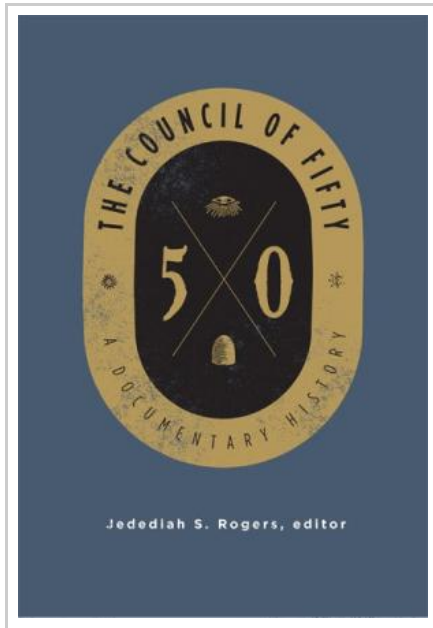




The Council of Fifty: A Documentary History

He was fond of the U.S. Constitution but distrusted democracy, even ?republican forms of government,? because people could as easily turn against you as stand by you. Instead, he voiced approval of ?theocracy,? the church president heading a council of Mormons and non-Mormons who would oversee secular matters. He put his idea into practice in 1844 in Illinois by creating the secret Council of Fifty, saying it would replicate the ?councils of the gods? in heaven. His intent was to have an organization that would secretly supervise political campaigns and send explorers out in search of locations where the church could establish satellite colonies. As events unfolded, their scouting forays into Oregon and Texas proved useful when things fell apart in Illinois and they began looking for a new home base. In the Great Basin the council oversaw everything from water rights to the regulation of hunting and grazing during the first few years in the valley. The council later appointed a Committee of Seven to monitor the federal ?Board of Registration and...



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
